

DRAFT – Possible Changes to ASERL’s Membership Criteria

<p>Requirements for Membership.</p> <p>(a) The requirements for eligibility for membership in the Association include each of the following:</p> <p>(1) Location in the southeastern region of the United States (including the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia);</p> <p>(2) Adherence to purposes and goals of the Association as set forth in the Articles of Incorporation;</p> <p>(3) Qualification of the educational institution under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or as a governmental agency; and</p> <p>(4)</p> <p>(i) Educational institutions must confer the doctorate degree in one or more fields and spend on their libraries annually a minimum of one-half (½) the mean expenditure of member educational institution libraries for total library expenditures derived after eliminating the single highest and the single lowest value. Applicants for new membership in the Association must meet this threshold for the three years prior to the date of application.</p> <p>(ii) Because the programs and services of the State Library Agencies (SLAs) complement and support the mission and services of research libraries in the Southeast, all state library agencies of the states covered by ASERL shall be eligible for ASERL membership, contingent upon payment of annual dues. Each ASERL library must also meet at least two of the following:</p> <p>(i) Annually spend on their libraries a minimum of one-half (½) the mean expenditure of member educational institution libraries for total library expenditures derived after eliminating the single highest and the single lowest value.</p> <p>(ii) Actively participate in two or more major programming efforts offered by ASERL, (e.g., Kudzu, shared print retention, and/or others that are implemented by a significant portion of ASERL’s membership) and otherwise support ASERL’s collaborative goals and spirit;</p> <p>(iii) The library possesses unique and extraordinary qualifications as part of a research institution that bring important strategic benefits to ASERL members.</p> <p>(5) Applicants for new membership in the Association must meet the library expenditure threshold for the three years prior to the date of application, and must continue to meet the library expenditure threshold for the first five years of membership. Failure to meet this threshold during the initial five years of membership may result in the library being placed on Probation by the Board of Directors.</p> <p>(6) Because the programs and services of the State Library Agencies (SLAs) complement and support the mission and services of research libraries in the Southeast, all state library agencies of the states covered by ASERL shall be eligible for ASERL membership, contingent upon payment of annual dues. Federal libraries must support comprehensive collections or research materials on a permanent basis.</p>
