

40 responses received



Does Scholars Trust continue to benefit your library and university?




2020 Review Survey Results Ability to withdraw duplicate titles held by others in Scholars Trust



2020 Review Survey Results Ability to reuse space for other print collections




2020 Review Survey Results Ability to repurpose space in our library





Retention commitment of the print journal




Reciprocal borrowing among the participants

Retention Nominations

- A title is "nominated" to be retained by the library that has the most complete run from among the top three holding libraries in the analysis.
- Where there is a tie for the top holding library (two or more libraries having equally complete holdings), more than one library may be nominated to retain the title.

Program Updates

Last Copy Pilot Initiative

- Rosemont Alliance Vision: "To ensure the preservation and availability of print journal."
- Retention commitments for over 102,000 titles.

Last Copy Pilot Initiative

- Used data from the CRL analysis for BTAA, EAST,
 Scholars Trust (ASERL) and WEST.
- Found 65,251 titles that are:
 - Held by a Rosemont Alliance library.
 - Have only one holding in both Rosemont and OCLC.
 - Do not have a retention commitment.

Last Copy Pilot Initiative

- Inviting a collections officer from each participating program
- Develop criteria to scope a pilot project focused on how we can best ensure these rarely held titles are secured and retained.
