ASERL Journal Retention Program

- **Late 1990s** – Paul Gherman & Paul Willis: Shared Monograph retention
- **2008-2009** – ASERL Shared Storage Study Group
- **Spring 2010** – ASERL Proposed Journal Retention Agreement instead of monographs
- **Fall 2010** – Aisha Harvey [Duke University] ASERL's first Visiting Program Officer, followed by Paula Sullenger [Auburn University]

- **January 2012** – TRLN commits all titles in their shared print program to the ASERL program.
- **Summer 2012** – Universities in Florida agree to create the FLARE statewide repository
- **January 2013** – WRLC commits its shared print journals to ASERL, joins ASERL's Resource Sharing Agreement
- **February 2013** – JRNL database launched, replacing spreadsheets
- **June 2013** – ASERL-WRLC Archiving agreement is branded as "Scholars Trust"



- **October 2015** – New Scholars Trust governance structure – a Governing Council (deans) and new, smaller Steering Committee (librarians/program managers)
 - April 2016 – First e-meeting of new Scholars Trust Steering Committee
 - May 2016 – First meeting of Scholars Trust Governing Council – Richmond, VA
 - October 2016 – First Scholars Trust Town Hall e-meeting
 - **Save the date!** Second Scholars Trust Town Hall e-meeting – **June 14, 2017, 2pm Eastern Time.**

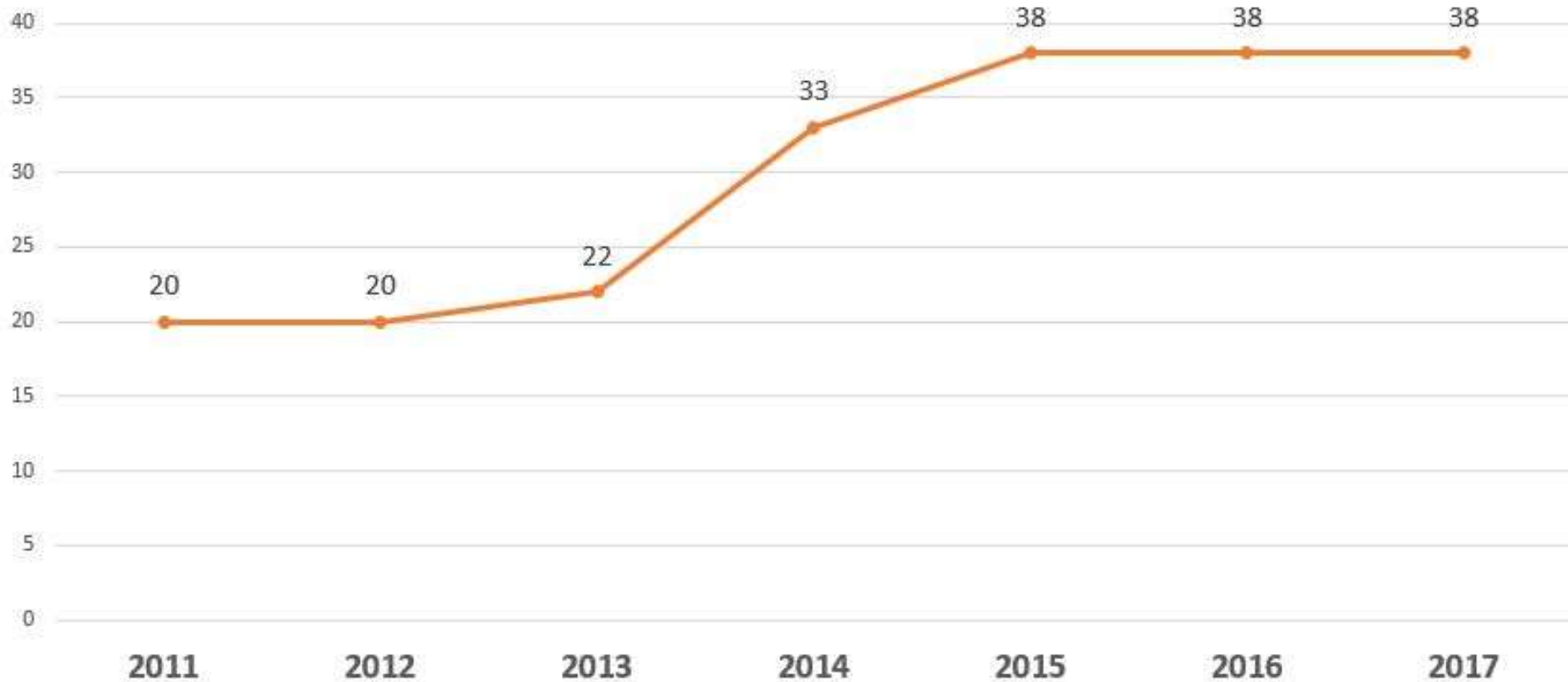

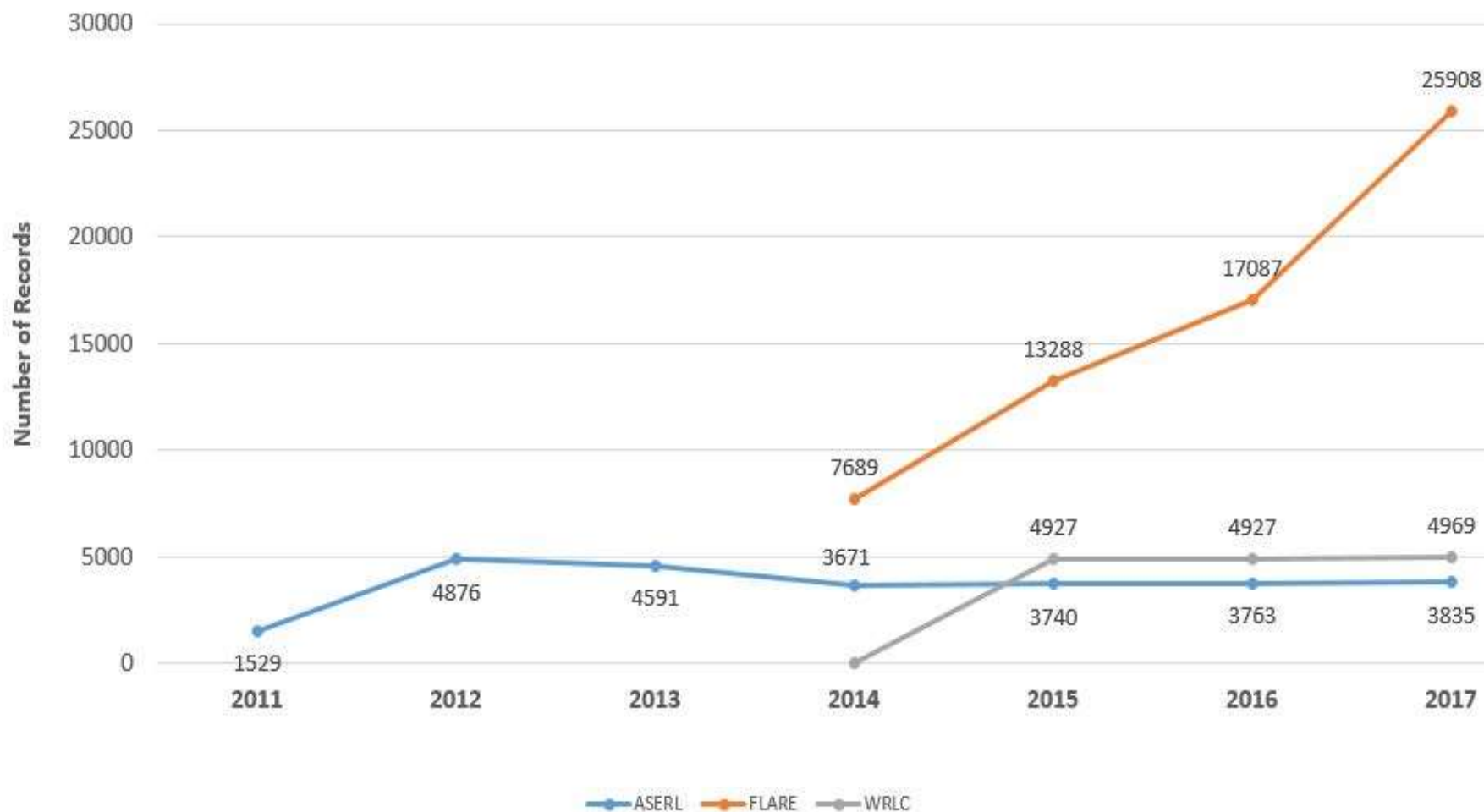

Program Growth

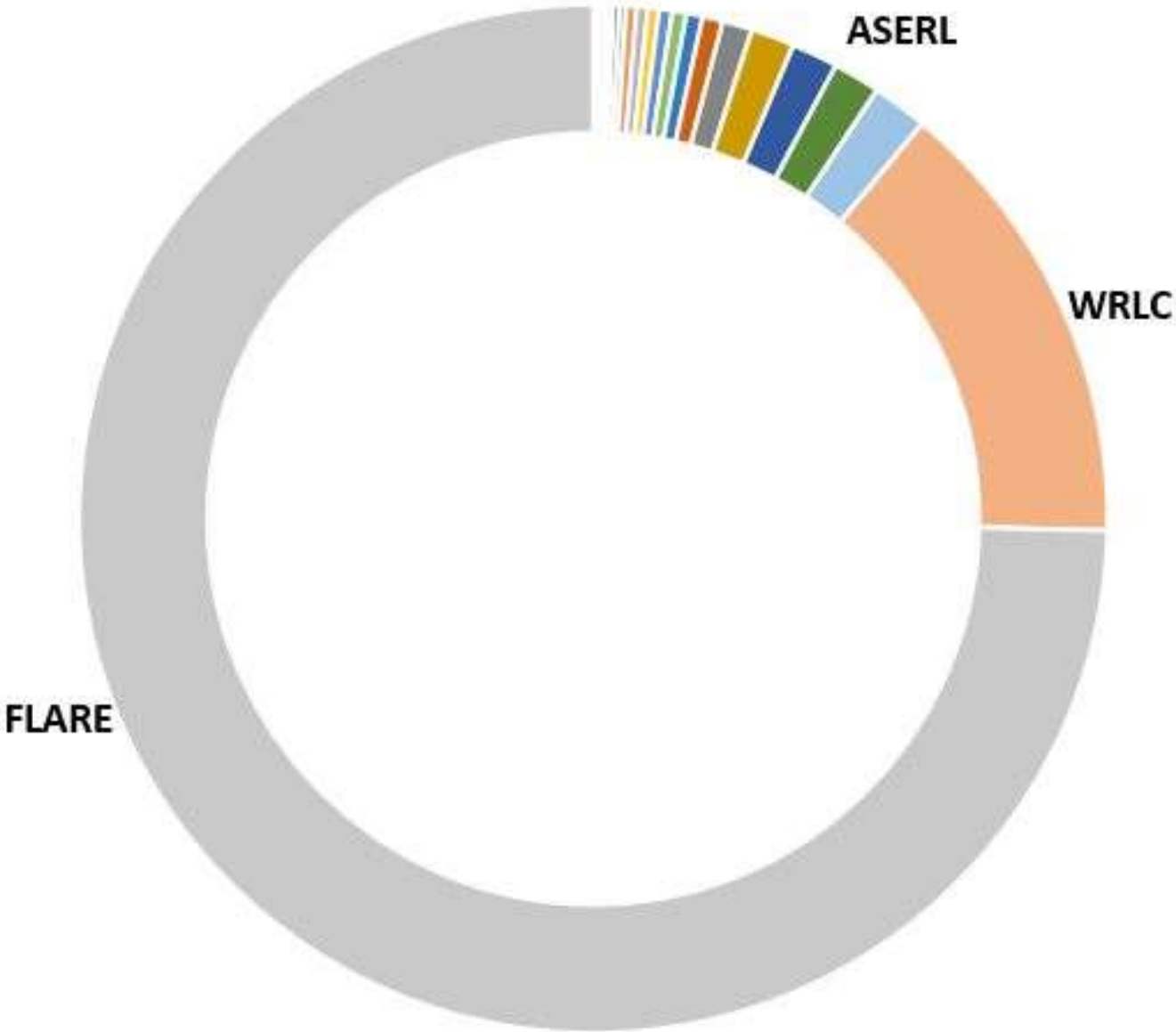
Libraries in Program



Retention by Program

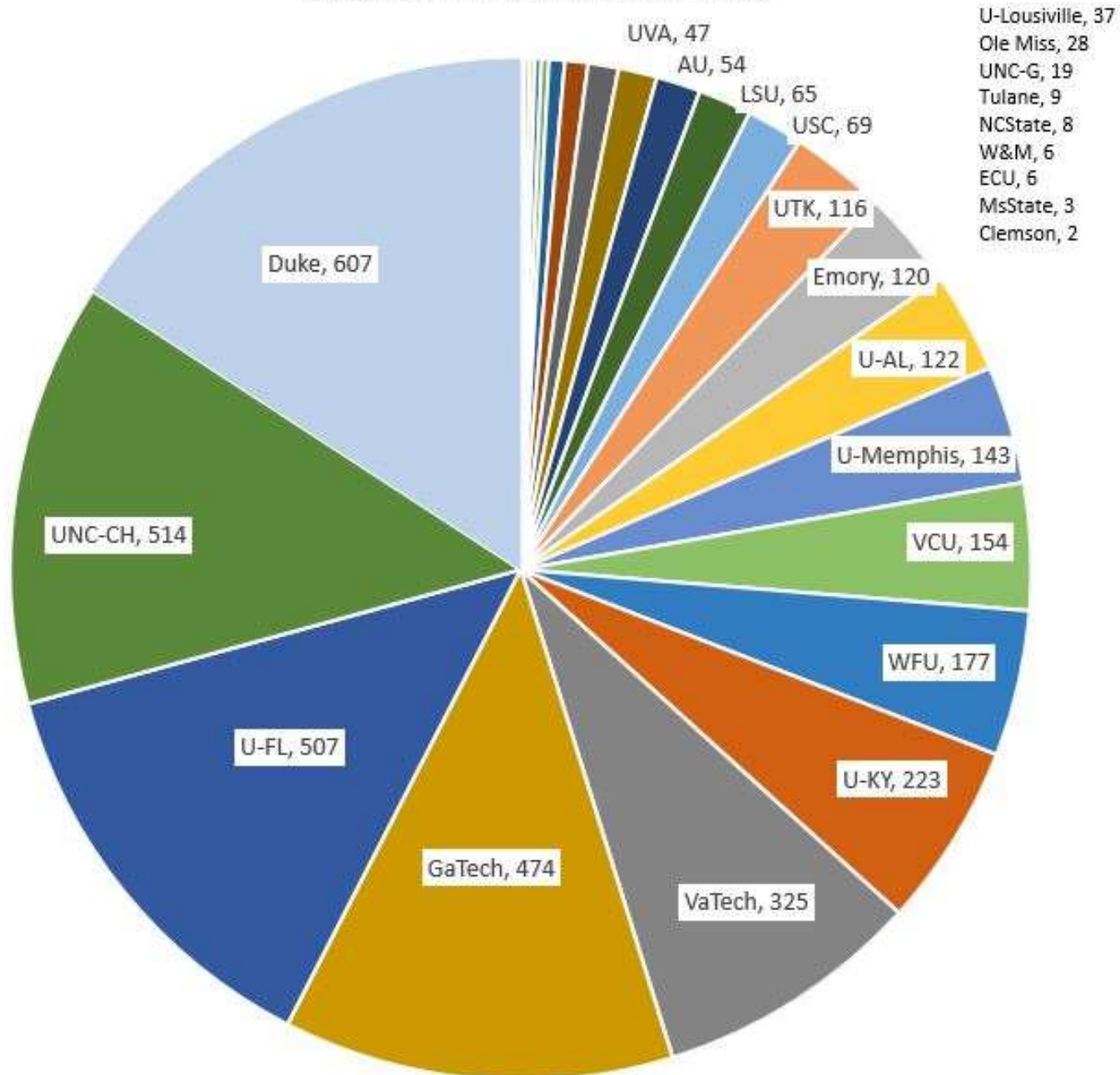


SCHOLARS TRUST TITLES BY PROGRAM

SHARED PRINT ALLIANCE

- Collaboration between print archiving programs
 - Scholars Trust, WRLC, FLARE, Western Regional Storage Trust (WEST), and Big 10 Academic Alliance (formerly CIC)
- Began meeting in October 2015
- Goal of increasing collaboration between these programs while increasing retention of print serials across the country
- Retain 100K more titles by 2021, ideally 3 copies of each
- Common guidelines for metadata, gap-filling, last copy retention
