# Shared Print – Gov Docs

- Revised ASERL Guidelines are approved & on file with GPO
- GPO has released new Guidelines for shared regionals
- Two libraries have notified ASERL of withdrawal as Center of Excellence
- In 2018: 295K items posted for adoption, 10K claimed
- Since 2012: 78,500 items have been adopted

# Shared Print Journals / Scholars Trust

- 31 of 38 ASERL libraries participate, retaining 37K titles
- 685 titles added since May 2018
- CRL Collection Analysis Pilot underway

# Scholars Trust/CRL Collection Analysis Pilot

- Six ASERL/CRL libs participated: Emory, Alabama, Florida, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia Tech
- 761K records submitted, weeded to 202K titles analyzed for overlap
- 136K titles held by 1 library, 1361 held by all 6
- Nominations based on completeness under review

- LOTS of movement in ILL technology field
  - Not dead yet: ILLiad & Relais D2D upgrades
  - New open source tool launched: ReShare
  - RAPID formally announces Bedrock v1.0

  - Webinar recordings getting heavy use

# ASERL Deans' Survey – Summer 2018

23 of 38 (61%) ASERL Deans participated -- including five in interim roles  
*(18 of 33 permanent deans = 54%)*

- Overall satisfaction w/ ASERL value = **4.7**  
*(5 = very satisfied)*
- Satisfaction w/ business processes = **4.8**  
*(5 = very satisfied)*
